Richemont International Scholarship for the MSc Global Leadership and Peacebuilding programme for an African student living in the UK (1 Award available)

About the Award

This [scholarship](#) funding is available to an African student living in the United Kingdom applying for the [MSc Global Leadership and Peacebuilding](#) at King's College London, for the 2022/23 academic year (beginning in September 2022). It is available to students studying full time only.

There is **1 award** open to African students in the UK applying for the full-time programme who will be present in London throughout the academic year. The student must be of African heritage and be eligible for home fees.

The award is open to African change-makers within their communities who are interested in any and all aspects of Global Leadership and Peacebuilding. Applicants should be clear about why studying this programme will help them enact transformative change in Africa.

Recipients will be selected based on merit and the overall standard of their application (see application details for full information and expectations below).

The scholarship covers the value up to **£11,040** for 2022/23 full-time entry for one student onto their relevant course; as well as the additional **£400** cost of the Leadership Weekend Workshop that is a compulsory component of the programme.

Please note the award does not cover living costs and recipients are expected to cover these on their own or from other sources.

This funding has been provided by Richemont International, a long-term friend of King's College London and the African Leadership Centre.

How to Apply

- All applicants should complete the King's College London online application process for the MSc Global Leadership and Peacebuilding, by clicking the [Apply button on the online programme pages](#) and follow all necessary steps.

- The personal statement submitted for the MSc application must include: a brief sentence stating that you have also applied for this specific award; as well as an explanation of how you intend to fund your studies if your application for this funding is **unsuccessful**.
- In addition, applicants need to submit a 1-2 minute video recording of themselves to alc@kcl.ac.uk . **Videos longer than 2 minutes will be deleted and not considered for applications.** That video should include the applicant explaining:
 - Why they are applying to the programme;
 - Why you consider yourself an African (e.g. by birth, family heritage, citizenship etc);
 - What they see as the most pressing global leadership and peacebuilding challenge that is relevant to Africa;
 - The change they want to make in relation to that issue in Africa; and
 - How they see the content of the MSc programme enabling them to make that change.
- In the email that you send the video to, **you must include in the email subject title your:** student application number; and title of the funding that you are applying for.
- The deadline to apply for the Richemont International Scholarship for the MSc Global Leadership and Peacebuilding programme is **30th June 2022, 23:59 GMT**.
